The history of the encounter between the British and Transylvanian peripheries could not have been told the way it is told in this thesis, without the invention of the print and without the existence of a common practice among the European aristocracy for as far back as the Antiquity: object collecting. In the *Dicționarul explicativ al limbii române (Dictionary of the Romanian Language)*, the collector is defined as a person who collects objects, a person who makes or has a collection.

Behavioural patterns that we categorize as specific to a collector have existed since ancient Roman society. Gaius Verres, at one point governor of Sicily, I. Licinius Luculus and M. Tullius Cicero are among the most well known collectors from that period and society. If in Roman Antiquity, the main interest for collectors was the material culture of Ancient Greece, in the next historical period, the Middle Ages, a change took place. The interest was no longer in the Pagan Antiquity, as it was pejoratively called by Christians, but in the remains of saints.

The discoveries of artefacts, even if some of them accidental, were a relatively common occurrence in the Middle Ages. Hard to believe it or not, people from that era had this kind of activities. There was even an official side regarding the discovery and collecting of artefacts, and the institution that managed it was the Church. Clergymen were preoccupied with the digging up the past, in the 13th century for various reasons. One had to do with the position occupied by the Church in Medieval society. In a world governed by the economic, cultural and social capital of the Church, it was practically impossible for this particular institution not to get involved in different local projects, regardless of their nature. A second reason was because many excavations happened in the vicinity of churches, usually for the renovation and enlargement of the edifices. The 13th century was, after all, the age of the cathedrals. The most imposing religious buildings from Europe date from that period of the end of the 12th century and from the 13th. To discover the remnants of an historical figure, especially of a saint, on a property belonging to a parish, could have brought the economic and cultural revival of the local community; or in other words: money and prestige for the local parish and community. The 13th century was a time of pilgrimage and to possess holy relics meant the entrance of that particular church in the pilgrimage route.

The slight secularization of life, which began in the 14th century, but especially after that, made an impact including in antiquarian activities. Rich families, both noble and bourgeois, found in collecting and storing objects in a private cabinet, among other things, a way to meditate on the past, and with the Reformation, on the local history, even on the non-ecclesiastical one. The result of this practice was the appearance and spreading of the

cabinets of curiosities from one corner of Europe to the other. This invention was so successful among cultivated Europeans, that Daniel Guilelmus Mollerus wrote in 1704, in his doctoral thesis, that the Earth was God's cabinet of curiosities.

From the cabinet of curiosities, collections began to grow in size and diversify in terms of the objects they contained. An ever growing attention was devoted in the proper organization of a book collection. Hence the numerous works such as *Bibliothèque ancienne et moderne. Pour servir de suite aux bibliothèques universelles et choisies* (1714-1730), *Bibliothèque choisie* ale lui Jean le Clerc și *Bibliographie instructive* (1763-1768). The large encyclopedic libraries of the Enlightenment Era contained thousands of volumes, from all major fields of knowledge, as it was divided in that time: Theology, History, Law, Sciences, Arts and Literature. Despite this aspect, in some private libraries particular fields of knowledge or authors dominated. One third of the library of count Sámuel Teleki, for instance, comprised Ancient authors. Another example is the library of Carl Friedrich Trier, which had a large number of works related to Natural Sciences.

As a periphery of the Habsburg Empire and of Catholic and Protestant Europe, Transylvania was also touched by the fever of the cabinets of curiosities. Few collections of the Transylvanian aristocracy – regardless whether we are referring to the urban or rural, secular or ecclesiastical one, came close to the scale and diversity of those made in Sibiu by the baron Samuel von Brukenthal (1721-1803) and in Alba Iulia by the Catholic bishop of the Principality, Ignác Batthyány. At the inventory made shortly after his death, in 1803, the collection of Samuel von Brukenthal comprised approximately 16.000 volumes, many paintings of renowned European artists, coins, minerals, maps and other objects with historical value even in that time. On the other hand, the library of Ignác Batthyány, at the time of his death, was estimated to contain around 18.000 volumes.

A small part of the two Transylvanian libraries, around 4% of Brukenthal's and a little over 1% of Batthyány's consisted of editions printed in the opposite side of Europe, in the island of Great Britain, between the 16th and 18th century. In spite of this small portion of the two libraries, the stories behind these British editions, from their creation to their resting place on the shelves of the libraries of the two aristocrats, are the sources of information regarding the mechanisms of the book market and the mentalities in the Modern Era, from across Europe. And so we arrive to the next concept which has to be addressed, that of *Homo Europæus*, because: what demonstration of the existence of a *Homo Europæus* in the 18th century would have greater weight than the one which takes into consideration two opposite regions of the continent?

Right from the beginning of his work *Tentația lui Homo Europæus*, Victor Neumann wrote that the desire to examine: „the controversial and, sometimes, contested spiritual physiognomy of the European East of the Austria capital” determined him to analyze the interests of important figures from this region. The spiritual physiognomy, as Neumann called it, was, of course, mainly determined by books, due to the fact that they were in those times the main vehicle of transmitting cultural patterns. Therefore, in order to get an idea of the intellect of the Eastern European aristocrat from the 18th century, one must see what kind of books were in his library.

But before seeing what books existed in this type of libraries, they, the books, as well as the collectors themselves must be integrated in an European context, in the general picture of the circulation of information or in that of the European geography of knowledge, as Burke named it, in the Modern Era. If one does not make this contextualization, a viable comparison between the so-called central and peripheral cultural models is impossible. Thus, the first analysis must be directed towards the behaviour of the actors of the European book market in the 17th and 18th centuries. Secondly, how did the books from one periphery end up in the opposite side of Europe and, the main question, the one that served as motivation for this present analysis and contributed to the crystallization of the goal, objectives and structure of this particular research: keeping in mind the above mentioned regarding the peripheral positioning of Transylvania and the slightly controversial nature of the Eastern *Homo Europæus*, in the cases of Samuel von Brukenthal and Ignác Batthyány are we dealing with two regional, local, cultural behaviours or the two Transylvanians can truly be seen as examples of *Homo Europæus*?

Having said these, the aim of this research is to offer an in-depth examination, both from a quantitative and qualitative approach, of the kind of books produced in the North-Western European periphery, the island of Great Britain, that ended up in the libraries in the opposite side of Europe, in Transylvania, by two case studies: the British books from the library of Samuel von Brukenthal and those from the library of Ignác Batthyány. To reach this goal, several aspects, objectives had to be pursued, related to both libraries as well as to the European book market, in general. Firstly, the book market had to be known, its mechanism, its caprices, who did it functioned (Chapter 2). Then, because the circulation of books from North-West to East is involved, an analysis of the presence of British books in Central-European libraries and on the Central-European book market was necessary (Chapter 3). Only by undertaking these two researches a proper integration of the two Transylvanian collections in a European context was possible and exaggerated claims, positive and negative, about the British books from the libraries of Brukenthal and Batthyány were avoided. From

this logic, the present thesis was divided into five chapters, each following one of the objectives mentioned above.

In the second chapter, entitled with a question: *A market with caprices?*, I offered, by means of examples from the literary and scientific journals such as the *Journal des Sçavans*, from the instructive bibliographies, from the book auction catalogues, correspondance etc., the main characteristics of the European book market in the 17th and 18th centuries. What surfaced were some aspects, some positive, others negative, that guided me to put this particular title. Can we say about the European book market in the mentioned period that it was one with caprices? If the answer is yes, how did those caprices manifested, how did the people involved reacted to them, how did they tried to fix them and get by them and so on are the main subjects treated in the seven subchapters of this first chapter.

In the first two subchapters, *Cum privilegio* and *Sub patronajul tău (Under your patronage)*, two fundamental characteristics of the market have been analyzed: the existence of printing and distribution privileges and the need for a patron to take under his protection and authority an author or editor who had manuscripts suited for publishing. A considerable parte of the information regarding these aspects have been collected from the British books, from their title pages and prefaces, but also from the sources mentioned above.

Besides the privileges and patronage, two *sine qua non* traits of the European book market in the Modern period, censorship was also very present. Censorship came from both secular and ecclesiastical authorities and it affected authors, editors, printers and booksellers, especially when they published texts that were dangerous for the establishment: works that criticized the monarch, the Church, science and theological books which contained discoveries or theories that were to far from the general accepted viewpoint or from the dogma, to be tolerated and promoted by printing them. The cases described in this third parte of the chapter, *Editio castigata*, are examples on how censorship manifested on the book market, on what were the reasons behind the censoring of a book etc.

Related to censorship were the illegal, surreptitious prints. So many circulated on the European market that some librarians took pride in the fact that „almost all editions” from their bookstores were original ones. In this subchapter, I turned my attention on the surreptitious prints. These took many forms, from plagiarism to editions which had false information related to the printer etc. on the title page. This fourth characteristic of the market is the subject of this part called *Aproape toate edițiile (Almost all editions)*.

The literary and scientific journals of the time, active cells of a network of cultural information, and the bookstore catalogues revealed that marketing was not only important

even 2-3 centuries ago for librarians and printers, but that it was also frequently used by them in promoting their products, to inform potential clients about new editorial projects, and not only. Publicity is the main trait analyzed in this fifth subchapter entitled: *Ne vom dubla eforturile* (*We will double our efforts*), after a message of the editor of the *Journal of Scientists* had for his readers.

Prices are also fundamental to the book market. One cannot research the production and circulation of books without understanding prices, the monetary value attributed to books. In this subchapter, *Se vinde cu...* (*For sale at...*), I tried to exemplify what were the main factors that influenced the prices of books and to determine, for instance, what were the prices of the same edition in different parts of Europe. With some restraints given by the complexity in calculating the purchasing power of some currencies in the past and in different areas of the continent, I made some equivalences between them, for example, of the German Florins into Ducats of Naples.

In an era when transportation barely changed, delivering books in safety was not a given fact. The whims of the weather and of the people themselves could have delayed or ruin a delivery entirely. In this part, *Au sosit în sfârșit* (*Finally, they have arrived*), I focused on land transportation because it seems that it was the preferred one by the actors of the book market. By the examples given here, I tried to offer a general picture regarding the problems that appeared in the transportation of books, even before they were printed and till they arrived on the shelves of the buyer's library.

Cărți britanice pe piața central-europeană a cărții (1756-1796) (*British books on the Central-European book market*) is the third chapter of this research. It is constructed on four parts, each focusing on a particular region. As the title suggests, this chapter deals with the presence of British books on the Central-European book market. Throughout the chapter, I pointed out the specificity of each region in terms of the British books it had to offer.

In the first part of this chapter, I analyzed books printed in Britain from the Vienesse market. The capital city of the Habsburgs occupies an important role in the whole thesis from various points of view. Vienna is the most documented city in this research. For this reason, it occupies an entire subchapter, as compared to cities from the other European local markets analyzed which were grouped according to their respective region: Germany, Italy, Hungary and Transylvania.

The second subchapter is about British books in the German market. Four private libraries were analyzed: of Johann Lorenz von Mosheim from Göttingen (auctioned in 1756), of the Elector of Saxony in Dresden (1775-1777), of physician Peter Pasquay from Frankfurt

am Main (1777) and of Ludwig Philipp Wittwer from Nürnberg (1794). Besides these, the Library of the Richterian Museum (1784), as well as three booksellers from Leipzig (1777-1778 and 1781) were also searched for British books.

The next regional market was the Italian one. Unlike other parts, in the case of the Italian market, only bookstores' catalogues were analyzed, all of which are kept in the Batthyaneum Library. These are from booksellers from Naples, Rome, Venice, Florence and Padova, such as: Fratelli Terres, Nicola Lizzani, Haeredes Baleoni, Venanzio Monaldini, Carlo Scapin and others. The results have shown a characteristics of British books not only on the Italian market, but on the whole European market.

The last region under focus was that of present day Hungary and Transylvania, to be more precise, cities such as: Buda, Pest and Sibiu. Three catalogues appeared in Buda, out of which one has both Buda and Trnava as place of editing, another has Buda and Bratislava and the other just Buda, and they are all bookstore catalogues. Four other catalogues were printed on the other side of the Danube, in Pest. Three of these are from auctions that took place at the University Library and the nature of the fourth catalogue is uncertain, because there is no specification whether it came from a library auction or from a bookstore. In terms of the catalogues from Sibiu, four have been analyzed, all of them from the bookseller Martin Hochmeister, from the years 1779, 1784, 1787 and 1795. The latter was also edited in Cluj. Moreover, the search for British books on the Transylvanian market to into consideration two other auctions. One of them took place at the Reformed High School in Aiud, in april 1779, and the other at the Reformed High School from Târgu Mureş, from december 1780.

The fourth chapter, *British books from Samuel von Brukenthal's library*, treats both quantitative and qualitative aspects related to the editions printed in the island of Great Britain that belonged to Brukenthal. It is divided in four parts, modelled on Guillaume-François de Bure's division of his *Bibliographie instructive*, meaning based on the fields or classes of knowledge, as it was divided in that time: Theology, History, Law, Sciences, Arts and Literature. Thus, in the first subchapter I analyzed Brukenthal's British books from the class of Theology, in the second those from History and so on. The only collective subchapter is the third and it comprises British books of Law, Sciences and Arts.

Each of these four subchapters is divided in two parts, based on the specificity of the books. For instance, the subchapter dealing with Brukenthal's British books on Theology has two parts entitled *Hristos, Calea și Adevărul (Christ, the Way and the Truth)*, after the title of a book from this particular collection, and the other is about Brukenthal's British Bibles

and bears the title *Biblia britannica*. The same method and logic have been applied to the other subchapters.

The last chapter, *British books from the library of Ignác Batthyány*, was organized on the same pattern as the previous. From the method of work to the titles of the chapters and the overall structure. Therefore the fifth chapter is organized based on the classes of knowledge in four subchapter, each of the latter also being divided in parts such as: *Istorie ecleziastică și literară* (*Ecclesiastical and literary history*) and *Istorie profană universală* (*Universal profane history*) are the two parts of the History subchapter; the subchapter of Literature was divided in *Cultul Antichității* (*The Cult of Antiquity*) and *Pasiunea pentru gramatici și lexiconane* (*Passion for grammars and lexicons*) and so on.

The research of British books from Samuel von Brukenthal's library as well as from Ignác Batthyány's, but also of those on the European book market, was conducted in three major steps. The first was defining the key words, the key concepts: *British book*, *British space*, *periphery* (geographical and cultural). It was a fundamental phase for setting the boundaries of this present research. In other words, what do I understand by *British book* and by Great Britain? What are the criterias based on which these concepts were defined? In the case of the first, the place of editing was the criteria.

By *British books* I do not understand just those books printed in English or Welsh or in any other language indigenous to the island of Great Britain, but I am referring to the books printed in that space, regardless of the author or language of that particular book. Thus, the analysis took into consideration books in Latin, French, German, Italian etc. that were printed in England and Scotland. Due to the fact that only three books printed in Ireland have been identified, I included these also in the statistics. The choosing of this spatial criteria and not the one based on language, as it was often the practice in the 18th century for categorizing books as *English Books* (meaning in English), because, as I already mentioned, the aim of this research is to track the circulation of books from one periphery of Europe to the other. IN such an analysis, the language of the book is not necessarily of interest, as is the place of editorial appearance.

More than nowadays, in the 16th-18th centuries, knowledge was not evenly distributed in Europe and in the world. What is the place of Transylvania in that geography of knowledge, as Peter Burke called it? A research concerning the presence of British books in Transylvanian libraries from the 18th century cannot answer such a complex question. But making an inventory of these books can draw a first picture of the cultural liaisons between Transylvania and Great Britain, seen as two peripheries of Europe. And so we reach the next

fundamental concept of the present work, of the *periphery* and, with it, of the *center*. If one researches the British books from Modern Age Transylvania, one most probably will encounter the pioneering works on center and periphery of Immanuel Wallerstein and Fernand Braudel. Although the two books analyzed the general structure of the European modern economy, Wallerstein's concepts of center and periphery and Braudel's *economie monde* offer the general framework of trade and circulation of books and ideas in 18th century Europe.

The second phase of this research consisted in the counting of the British books from the two Transylvanian libraries and deciding on a criteria on which to undertake this operation. This part can also be divided into other two phases. Firstly, I transcribed all books printed in Great Britain that appear in the inventory of Brukenthal's library and in that of Batthyány's. Once having transcribed all of these books, over 600 in Brukenthal's library and approximately 200 in Batthyány's, I had to search for their shelf numbers, in order to closely analyze them. This is when the first major methodological difficulties started, related to a at a first glance simple aspect: choosing a criteria on which to count the books.

Deciding on a number of British books from the two libraries was not as easy because of the fact that several titles are bound together (*colligatum*). In other words, there is no perfect equivalency between the notion of *title*, *edition* etc. and that of *book*, precisely because some were not bound individually, but collectively. I decided that the best criteria is to count the books based on the idea of *edition*.

After these phases of counting and copying the books and categorizing them based on a class of knowledge, the next step began, that of the qualitative approach. For this, I used especially the dictionaries of rare books, the instructive bibliographies and literary and scientific journals of the 17th and 18th centuries, such as: de Bure's *Bibliographie instructive* the *Dictionnaire bibliographique*, edited in four volumes (Paris, 1791, 1802), *Dictionnaire Historique et Critique de la Bible* of Augustin Calmet, *Manuel du libraire* of J. C. Brunet, *Trésor des livres rares* of Johann G. T. Grässe. In terms of the scientific and literary journals I analyzed over 50 volumes from the *Journal des Sçavans*, which turned out to be an extraordinary source of information regarding new editorial appearances of the time and on how the book market functioned. Other periodical were le Clerc's *Bibliothèque choisie* and *Bibliothèque ancienne et moderne*. Also for the qualitative part of the research, I have used various manuscripts from the Brukenthal House Archive (Mss. 97-101, 112-114), from the Batthyaneum Library and from the National Archives in Sibiu.

The analysis of Samuel von Brukenthal's British books showed an encyclopedic secular *Homo Europaeus*, with a balanced interest in all major fields of knowledge. The fact that many of his British books were in English, which was not so common in that time outside Britain, with few exceptions such as the library of Johann Lorenz von Mosheim, the library of the Elector of Saxony and that of Johann Jacob Schultens, suggests that the baron has foreseen that British civilization and culture was preparing to conquer the world not just by the force of arms, but also by its language and science.

On the other hand, judging Batthyány by his collection of British books, a slightly different profile takes shape. Firstly, he had less than 1/3 the number of British books than Brukenthal and half of Sámuel Teleki's collection. Religion probably has its part in this configuration, as well as his profession. Secondly, Batthyány's British books are in general different from Brukenthal's, the loisir lectures being almost absent. Instead, Batthyány had many books on Theology, History and Sciences, fully understandable considering his scholarly activities.
